Total Duration	90 Minutes

Learning Outcome Matrix	Knowledge <i>Understanding of the main facilitating elements to promote digital literacy and critical thinking in young migrants.</i>

	Learning objectives <i>Young migrants will gain knowledge on how to improve their digital literacy, critical thinking and, consequently, their motivation.</i>
Introduction	<p>Ice Breaker – Interconnected (10 minutes)</p> <p>The trainer will encourage participants to count from 1-20, without interruptions. Participants will do so, each by each, meaning that if two or more participants say the same number, the game starts over from the beginning.</p>
Theoretical Contents	<p>Theoretical Presentation (20 minutes)</p> <p>The trainer introduces the topics of “Critical Thinking” and “Common Sense”.</p> <p>The theoretical contents are explained in the additional resources document “Module 1 – Theoretical Contents”</p>
Learning Activities	<p>Activity 1. Videos (25 minutes)</p> <p>With the whole group, watch two videos that shows what is common sense and what is metacognition, adding some reflection questions at the end:</p> <p>Common sense: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cxfhY1JJBqY Metacognition/Critical Thinking: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=urNcjYyalvY (please see video template above)</p> <p>Activity 2. Digital Zines (35 minutes) – includes a QR code linked to Canva templates</p> <p>Learners will be encouraged, as a final activity, to develop zines aimed to summarize the learnings of this module and as a visual tool to spread awareness on the barriers and facilitators of a digital inclusion and digital literacy. The trainer shall:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Engage groups of five.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide the QR Code so that participants can access the Canva template where they will work on. • Encourage a discussion between the members of the groups regarding the module topics' main aspects they would like to portrait in their zines.
